The Community

Teaneck is a suburban community of approximately 39,800 residents located five miles west of New York City. It is populated by residents' representative of varying ethnic, religious and cultural backgrounds and was the first to voluntarily integrate its schools in 1963. Teaneck's history includes a strong emphasis on education and prides itself on diversity. Teaneck High School's its araduation requirements have been constructed with full knowledge of the Core Content Standards of the New Jersey Department of Education.

The district's schools meet the educational needs of over 4,000 students. The 2016-2017 expenditure per student was \$26,372. At the high school approximately 23% of students receive free lunch and 9.8% received reduced charge lunch. The ethnic composition of the class of 2017 was 11.11% Caucasian; 46.98% African-American; 12.06% Asian; 29.84% Hispanic/Latino.

Graduation Requirements

Students must earn a minimum of 140 credits and fulfill Graduation Assessment Requirements set by the NJDOE.






SAT Scores Compared




ACT Scores Compared
