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Understanding the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment

The New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment is designed to measure the extent to which students are graduation ready in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics.

- Graduation readiness is reported separately for each content component.
- The ELA component is aligned to the grade 10 standards.
- The Mathematics component is aligned to Algebra I and Geometry standards.
- Statute requires that the State graduation proficiency assessment be administered to all grade 11 students. (N.J.S.A. 18A:7C-6)
- Students who are unable to take the assessment as juniors must take the assessment in their senior year.



Second Pathway towards Meeting the Graduation Requirement

If after completing the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment a student does not demonstrate proficiency on the ELA or mathematics section, the student is then eligible for a **second pathway** to meet the New Jersey Graduation Assessment Requirement.

Support for Students: Second Pathway - Accuplacer






- The ACCUPLACER is a series of tests that evaluate students' skills in reading, writing, and or mathematics.
- There's no time limit on the tests, so you can focus on doing your best to demonstrate your skills.
- ACCUPLACER uses the latest computer-adaptive technology, which means the questions the students see are based on their skill level.



Support for Students: Second Pathway - Accuplacer





Step 1: Students will be grouped for small group sessions or individual sessions with a Teaneck High School English Teacher and/ or Mathematics Teacher.

Step 2: Students will review prerequisite skills from Algebra 1, Geometry and English/Language Arts. Review sessions will include ACCUPLACER-like problems and questions. Teachers will review the skills associated with each question.

Step 3: After review, teachers will administer the ACCUPLACER Assessment. If a student is unable to meet the qualifying score, students will continue to review the skills needed and retake the ACCUPLACER at a different time.
