Be It Resolved, that the Teaneck Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the following **Finance and Budget** resolutions:

1. **Whereas**, the Teaneck Board of Education, in the County of Bergen, approves the Preliminary 2022-2023 School Year Budget for submission to the Department of Education for review and approval in accordance with N.J.S.A.18A:7F-6 as follows and,

Whereas, the said budget will be advertised in the Bergen Record in accordance with the format promulgated by the New Jersey Department of Education and according to law; and

Whereas, a Public Hearing on the budget for the 2022-2023 school year will be conducted during the April 27, 2022 Board of Education Meeting;

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, the GENERAL FUND tax levy of \$96,922,957 and DEBT SERVICE tax levy of \$694,400 are approved to support the 2022-2023 school year budget.

2. **Whereas**, the district has a taxing authority which is comprised of:

Whereas, the Board has approved that there should be raised, for the General Fund, a tax levy of \$96,922,957 which includes a 2% tax levy increase in the amount of \$1,900,450.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Teaneck Board of Education, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey approves that the unused, unexpired taxing authority of \$0 (Banked Cap) be held for potential use in the subsequent allowable fiscal years - none available this fiscal year.

3. **Whereas**, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A:5.2(a) mandates boards to establish annually prior to budget preparation, for public relations and each type of professional service, a maximum level of spending for the ensuing school year; and **Whereas**, the budget includes the following appropriations:

Whereas, the Administration needs to notify the Board if there arises a need to exceed said maximums, upon which the Board may adopt a dollar increase in the maximum amount through formal Board action; and

Whereas, the Board and Administration wishes to minimize the amount of paperwork involved in this area;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Teaneck Board of Education, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey establishes maximums for professional services in the areas listed above at a level of 120% of the amounts listed for the 2022-2023 school year.

4. Be It Resolved, that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3(a), which provides that the Teaneck Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted or such travel and expense reimbursement for the 2021-2022 school year, and

Whereas, school district policy and N.J.A.C.6A:23A-7.3(a) provides that the Teaneck Board of Education established in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for travel and expense reimbursement for the 2021-2022; and

Whereas, the maximum expenditure amount allotted for travel and expense reimbursement for the 2021-2022 was \$40,000; and

Whereas, travel and expense reimbursement has reached a total amount of \$25,344.65 as of March 1, 2022,

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Teaneck Board of Education, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2022-2023 at the sum of \$117,231 and,

Be It Further Resolved, that the Interim School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum is not exceeded.

5. Whereas, this budget includes a withdrawal from Capital Reserve, in the amount of \$2,810,450 with a net balance in Capital Reserve in the amount of \$2,826,754 and Whereas, the transfer of these reserves supports the following capital projects that are in addition to the Facilities Efficiency Standards determined by the Commissioner of Education necessary to achieve the Student Learning Standards adopted by the State Board of Education:

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that the amount authorized to be withdrawn from the Capital Reserve account is \$2,810,450.

6. **Whereas**, this budget included a withdrawal from Maintenance Reserve, in the amount of \$250,000, with a net balance in Maintenance Reserve of \$1,012,910 and **Whereas**, the transfer of these reserves supports maintenance and other facilities improvements that must be included in the district's annual M-1 and Comprehensive Maintenance Plan (the minimum amount that must be allocated to facilities maintenance).

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that the amount authorized to be withdrawn from the Maintenance Reserve Fund is \$250,000.
