Your Scholarship Essay DO'S AND DON'TS	
DO • Follow the instructions • Discuss 1 central point in each paragraph • Research your audience • Focus on strengths • Turn weaknesses into success stories • Use detailed, actual examples from your real life • PROOFREAD, PROOFREAD, PROOFREAD • Tell a story	DON'T • Open your essay with a quote • Use sentences like: "In this essay I will" • Use words that are new to you • Achievement-stuff your essay • Don't repeat your resume • Say that you need money outright • Have the EXACT same essay for every application tailor your essays

- No transcript until after graduation
- No SAT/ACT
- No letters of recommendation
- Qualifying students can apply for NJ STARS Program (Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship)

Four Year School (e.g. FDU)

- Apply by deadline (October January, mostly)
- THS needs to send information- transcripts, letters of recommendation
- Students send materials essay(s), SAT/ACT scores, etc.



WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH 2021 THEME "Valiant Women of the Vote: Refusing to Be Silenced.

Here's a little history on the women who's contributions often went unnoticed. The idea is to celebrate women's suffrage centennial despite the challenges they have faced.

Every year March is designated Women's History Month by Presidential proclamation. The month is set aside to honor women's contributions in American history.

Did You Know? Women's History Month started as Women's History Week

Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California. The Education Task Force of the Sonoma County Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California. The Education Task Force of the Sonoma County selected the week of March 8 to correspond with International Women's Day. The movement spread across the country as other communities initiated their own Women's History Week celebrations the following year.

In 1980, a consortium of women's groups and historians—led by the National Women's History Project (now the National Women's History Alliance) successfully lobbied for national recognition. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the Week of March 8th 1980 as National Women's History Week.

Rosa Parks

Parks helped initiate the civil rights movement in the United States when she refused to give up her seat to a white man on a Montgomery, Alabama, bus in 1955.

Shirley Chisholm

In 1972, Chisholm became the first African-American from a major political party to run for president and the first Democratic woman of any race to do so.

Jane Roe

In the landmark 1973 7-2 Roe v. Wade decision, the U.S. Supreme Court declared that the Constitution protects a woman's legal right to an abortion.

Sandra Day O'Connor

In 1981, O'Connor was sworn in by President Ronald Reagan as the first woman to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court.

Ruth Bader Ginsburg

In 1993, Ginsburg was named to the U.S. Supreme Court in 1993 by President Bill Clinton.

Hillary Clinton

In 2016, Clinton became the first woman to receive a presidential nomination from a major political party.

Kamala Harris

In 2021, Harris was sworn in as the first woman and first woman of color vice president of the United States.
