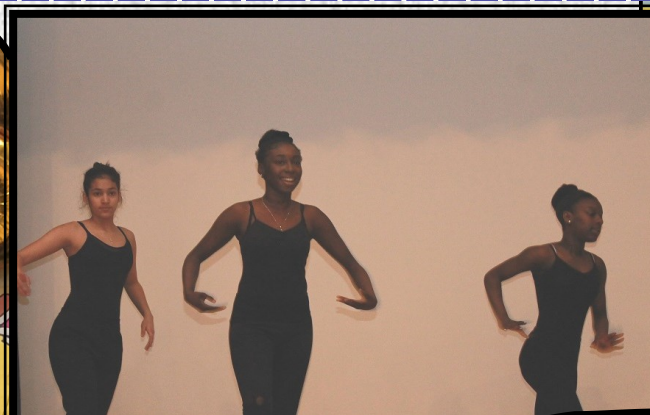

There are nine trustees, three of whom are elected each year for the three year terms. The Board of Education, acting as a group, develops and manages policy to govern the school district.

Regular Public Meetings

All are invited to the Board of Education Regular Public Meetings, which begin at 8 p.m. at the Teaneck High School, a handicapped accessible building, Cheryl Miller-Porter Student Center, third floor, 100 Elizabeth Avenue. The Board holds its one Regular Public Meeting on the second Wednesday of each month, September through June. Official business is conducted at this monthly meeting. The public may speak to agenda items prior to Board deliberations on the agenda and may address other issues at the conclusion of the business portion of the meeting. "Conversations with the Board" are scheduled at 7:30 p.m. before each Regular Public Meeting of the Board, but not before workshop meetings.

Workshop Sessions

On the first Wednesday of each month, September through June, the Board holds a workshop session in the Central Administrative Offices, Eugene Field School, a handicapped accessible building, Margaret Angeli Staff Development Room, One Merrison Street. At these monthly workshop meetings the Board reviews and discusses the business agenda that will be formally acted upon the following week. In addition to providing an opportunity to present information to the Board that requires action at the Regular Public Meeting, workshop meetings also include presentations on educationally relevant items of interest selected by the Superintendent with Board input. Communication is one of the district's most important priorities in addressing student achievement because it is one way of engaging parents to play an active role in their child's education. The Teaneck Public School District has set up numerous resources for parents to keep them informed about what's going on in the schools as well as their child's classroom. School Age Child Care (SACC) programs, for children whose parents are working or in school, are run by the Teaneck Community Education Center at Bryant School for Kindergarten and Pre-K children and at Hawthorne School, Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson Middle Schools and at Whittier School (morning only). SACC is a non-profit program supported solely by participants. In addition to SACC, there are independent, non-profit child care programs sponsored by Working Parents Associations (WPA) at Lowell and Whittier Schools.

A Pre-K Wrap option provides extended childcare for a half-day plus an included lunch period, so that Pre-K students registered in the Pre-K program are able to remain at Bryant School for a full school day.

The **Teaneck Council of Parents and Teachers** (known as the PTO Council) is the umbrella organization of six schools' PTOs and Hawthorne's PTA. The Council, comprising representatives from the individual organizations, meets to discuss education and parent issues.

A Parent Teacher Organization/Association meets monthly at each school. All are welcome.

At the kindergarten, elementary and middle schools, if the absence hasn't been reported, the nurse will call the parent later in the day. At Teaneck High School, if the absence isn't reported, it is considered non-excused until a signed note is submitted to the homeroom teacher.

Upon returning to school, a student must present a note signed by a parent, guardian or physician. This must include the student's name, date(s) and reason for absence.

According to Board of Education policy, excused absences include illness, approved religious holidays and/or death in the family. Students who are excused will be able to make up assignments and exams. Credit is not given for assignments missed during unexcused absences, but students who will be on vacation or visiting college/school campuses may make up work if prior approval has been granted by the school administrator. Board of Education policy specifically outlines penalties for high school students with excessive absences.

Have a concern? Whom do you call? Follow these steps!

The information can be found in "A Parent/Guardian's Guide to Resolving School Concerns and Complaints." Still not sure of which step to take?

Primary/Elementary: Teacher, Principal, then, if curriculum-related, Content Supervisor; Assistant Superintendent.

Middle School/High School: Teacher; Guidance Counselor (or Dean, if discipline-related); Assistant Principal; Principal; then, if curriculum-related, Content Supervisor; Assistant Superintendent.

Special Services: Teacher; Principal; Supervisor of Specialized Educational Programs.

All unanswered concerns/complaints should be sent to Dr. Christopher Irving, Superintendent of Schools, who will respond after making necessary inquiries. If you are not satisfied with the Superintendent's decision, you may bring the matter to the Board of Education by writing to the Board at One Merrison Street.

Transportation

The school a child attends is determined according to district lines established by Board of Education policy. Children who have registered for school and are eligible for transportation receive a bus route by the last week of August. Questions about transportation may be addressed to the secretary at the school the child attends. If necessary, parents will be referred to the transportation coordinator.

State law requires that transportation be provided as follows:

- pupils in grades K-8 who live more than 2 miles from school;
- pupils in grades 9-12 who live more than 2.5 miles from school;
- physically handicapped and special education, when needed; and radius of their homes

Children who live within walking distance of their school may not use the school buses at any time. Parents/guardians are responsible for walking their children to and from the bus stop. If you cannot meet your child in the afternoon, we recommend that you arrange for someone to meet your child at the bus stop.

Courtesy busing will be provided for students in grades preschool through fourth who reside more than 1.3 (busing trigger is 1.4) miles from their school of attendance.

Seat belts are used for all public and private school transportation. Procedures have been established between kindergarten and the elementary school child care programs to provide temporary care of the district's youngest children in the event that a parent is not at the bus stop when the child is dropped off.

Teaneck Community Education Center

Operating as an enterprise fund, under the Teaneck Board of Education, TCEC sponsors a number of programs that expand on the regular services provided by the District. The Center oversees the SACC (School-Age Child Care) programs at Bryant School, Hawthorne School, Whittier School (morning only), Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson Middle Schools and also provides a WRAP program for half-day, Pre-K children at Bryant School. TCEC runs a 6 week summer camp, Camp Kookooskoos. The Center also offers daytime and evening specialty classes for both children and adults.

School Age Child Care (SACC) programs, for children whose parents are working or in school, are run by the Teaneck Community Education Center at Bryant School for both Kindergarten and Pre-K children, Hawthorne School, Whittier School (morning only) and Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson Middle Schools. SACC is a non-profit program supported solely by participants. In addition to SACC, there are independent, non-profit child care programs sponsored by Working Parents Associations (WPA) at Lowell and Whittier Schools.

Pre-K Wrap is an additional half-day (paid) option for Teaneck children (ages 3 & 4) who have been accepted into the Teaneck Pre-K half-day program. The Teaneck Community Education Center runs a Pre-K Wrap program that provides extended childcare for a half-day plus an included lunch period, so that children who are accepted into the Pre-K program will be able to remain at Bryant School for a full school day. The program follows the Teaneck Public Schools calendar. There is a charge for this extended day program and space is limited. Busing may be provided for eligible children.

Camp Kookooskoos is a six-week program for children entering grades K-8. Campers enjoy sports, arts & crafts, science, music, swimming, special events, trips and more! Our goal is to provide a summer experience that offers enrichment, personal growth and fun in a safe, nurturing environment. Camp is run by a caring and enthusiastic professional staff of teachers, college students, and high school juniors and seniors. A full-time registered school nurse is on the grounds. We include an extended hours program (both before and after) for working families for an additional fee.

The Camp at Teaneck Creek, a two-week arts and science program run in collaboration with the Teaneck Creek Conservancy, is offered in the summer for children entering grades 2-5 at a minimal fee, thanks to a very generous grant provided by the Puffin Foundation. Children in grades 4-5 are immersed in courtroom adventures through improvisational theater activities during an award-winning program, Out of the Woods and Into the Courtroom. In addition, they explore and learn about the natural world of the Teaneck Creek Conservancy. Children entering grades 2-3 enjoy the exciting Hobby Quest programs of Kids & Cameras and Making Magic and develop skills that last a lifetime.

The Teaneck Community Education Center, located at Eugene Field, is open from 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. For additional information, please visit the Center, call (201) 833-5514, or visit the Teaneck Community Education Center's web page at www.teaneckschools.org.

Lunch/Breakfast

All Teaneck children may eat lunch in school. In addition, breakfast is available at all schools. The Board of Education has retained Maschio's as its food service management company.

Teaneck participates in the National Lunch Program through which children may purchase low-cost lunch, breakfast and milk, and may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. A la carte offerings or a balanced, complete meal are available at lunch and breakfast. Students eligible for free/reduced-price lunch qualify for free/reduced-price breakfast. Applications for free/reduced-price meals are mailed home during the month of August and will also be available to all students on the first day of school. Applications must be properly filled out and returned to your child's school as soon as possible. If you do not receive an application, please call the school your child attends or download an application at www.teaneckschools.org. Please fill out ONE application for all children in the same household. Children who were receiving free/reduced lunch/breakfast as of June 2018 will continue to receive free/reduced-price lunch/breakfast through the period of Sept 5, 2018—October 19, 2018 only. A new application **must** be filled out in order for them to continue receiving their free/reduced lunch/breakfast for the 2018-2019 school year. If a new application is not filled out by October 22, 2018, the free/reduced benefits will be terminated.

We will continue to offer the Online Meal Prepayment System, which is an easy and secure online prepayment service where parents can deposit money into their child's school meal account, view their account balance, and check their eating history report. The link is:

The lunch price for K-4 children will be \$2.70. Middle school students will pay \$2.85 for lunch. High school students will pay \$3.20 for lunch. The reduced-price lunch is 40 cents. A complete breakfast for K-4 students is \$1.40 and \$1.65 for those in grades 5-12. The reduced price is 30 cents. Deli sandwiches are available at the high school. All schools have salads, raisins and nuts, fresh fruits and other nutritionally appropriate foods.

The high school and middle schools use a personalized identification system through which students scan their ID badges or use a PIN code to purchase lunch/breakfast items. This enables them to buy items whether using their pre-paid account or paying with cash.

School Closings

In the event of snow or other hazardous weather conditions, the Teaneck Public Schools may announce a NO-SCHOOL DAY or a DELAYED OPENING.

Announcements are made by 6:30 a.m. on radio stations: WCBS (880 AM) and WINS (1010 AM); TV stations: Channels 2, 4, 5, 7, Cablevision Channel 12 and FiOS 1 News. In addition, this information will be available on the district website at www.teaneckschools.org.

The decision about keeping children home in bad weather (when schools are open) is up to the parent/guardian. If students are absent in such circumstances, teachers will make every effort to help them make up work that has been missed.

Please notify your staff of the following scheduling procedures in event of a snow day. Please be advised that the District follows two (2) schedules. Please inform your staff so that everyone is clear about the procedures because of the staff that travels between schools.

Secondary School(s) Schedule for Grades 5-12

In the event of a snow day, we treat the snow day as if school were in session at the secondary schools.

For example at the high school: if the day before the snow day was an "A" day and the snow day would have been a "B" day; the day after the snow day is an "A" day.

For example at the middle schools: if the day before the snow day was an "A" day and the snow day would have been a "B" day; the day after the snow day would be a "C" day.

Elementary School(s) Schedule for Pre-K-4

In the event of a snow day, we would treat the snow day as if it were a "NO" day so that if the day before a snow day was an "A" day and the snow day would have been a "B" day; the day after the snow day will be a "B" day.

Health Services

School nurses conduct screenings for vision, hearing and scoliosis (curvature of the spine); maintain student health records; administer medications; provide emergency care, and assist with the health and wellness program. School physicians provide physicals for the high school athletic program and review medical cases as required.

Ask about before—and after—school child care when you register. Applications for the programs at Bryant, BF, TJ and Whittier School (morning only) are available at the Community Education Center.

A child who will be five years old on or before October 1st should be registered for kindergarten the previous spring. Meetings are arranged with parents to determine the child's needs.

If you are transferring a child out of the Teaneck Public Schools, please notify the principal at least one week in advance. You will be given transfer papers to present to the new school and records will be forwarded.
