I am also extremely proud to announce that through the collaborative efforts of our staff (led by our Science Supervisor, Mr. Rolando Monserrat), a 10th grade student (Elias Sanchez), and our Teaneck community including our PTO's, our district created 340 face shields for Teaneck's healthcare and emergency personnel. These face shields were created using 3D printers and were recently donated to Holy Name Medical Center. As we move forward, there are a few important updates regarding grading, report card distribution, and our mental health services that we provide for all grade levels. However, I want to begin with Governor Murphy's recent announcement regarding school closures.

1. Governor Murphy on School Closures Beyond April

On Thursday, April 16, Governor Murphy announced that all school buildings will remain closed through May 15. Any decisions beyond this date will continue to be assessed by health and education officials.

2. Grading and Report Card Distribution

3. Mental Health Services

- a. Elementary & Middle Schools The Mental Health Services initiative that I announced back in February for students and their families will resume providing support to students in grades k-8. Parents can access these services by sending an email to your student's counselor or building principal.
- b. Middle and High School Our School Counselors are available to meet with students via Google Meets during school hours. In addition, counselors will also have Google Classrooms to share helpful tips, mindfulness activities, etc.

These are unprecedented times and we are all feeling the loss of our freedom – and even more devastating, the loss of loved ones. There is no shame in needing to have someone to talk to which is why I truly hope that you will take advantage of our mental health services available to you and your child/children.

Finally, it is critical that we continue to practice social distancing and all of the health guidelines that are now in place in order to keep everyone safe and healthy. Remember that anyone who wants to receive a boxed lunch for your children can visit us at Teaneck High School every workday from 11 am – 1 pm (drive-up on the Cranford Avenue side.)
