



LEARNING FOR STUDENTS IN QUARANTINE

The chart below outlines remote instruction guidelines for students who are quarantined.

| Individual Quarantine | Day One | <p>Students/families will receive notification regarding quarantine dates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students should log into Google Classroom for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Asynchronous Instruction; OR ○ Synchronous Instruction; OR ○ Streamed Instruction. <p>Asynchronous assignment may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Assignments currently being utilized; ● Videos that are aligned to the grade-level or content unit of instruction; and/or ● Instructional resources that are aligned to the current unit of instruction. | <p>Coded as “Remote Present”</p> <p>Student is considered a remote learner.</p> <p>Students will be coded as “remote absent” if they do not attend streamed or synchronous lessons, or if they do not complete asynchronous assignments.</p> |
| | Day Two Through the End of Quarantine | <p>Students will receive a Google MEET link to stream into their classes following their regular instructional schedule.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students will participate in streamed or synchronous instruction. ● Students will keep their cameras on throughout the entire session of the streamed or synchronous learning in order to receive credit for attendance. ● Students will need to be on time for each session. ● Students will need to participate/be present for the entire session, unless otherwise or arranged with the teacher. | <p>Coded as “Remote Present”</p> <p>Student is considered a remote learner.</p> <p>Students will be coded as “remote absent” if they do not attend streamed or synchronous lessons, or if they do not complete asynchronous assignments.</p> |
| Classroom Quarantine | | <p>When an entire classroom or school is closed, teachers will conduct lessons remotely and in real-time utilizing synchronous instruction.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students will follow the class schedule with their classmates. | <p>Students will be coded as “remote absent” if they do not attend streamed or synchronous lessons, or if they do not complete asynchronous assignments.</p> |

Remote Instruction/180-Day Requirement Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9, schools must be in session for 180 days to receive state aid. The statute requires that school facilities be provided for at least 180 days during the school year. Section (b) notes that where a district is required to close the schools of the district for more than three consecutive school days due to a declared state of emergency, declared public health emergency, or a directive and/or recommendation by the appropriate health agency or officer to institute a public health-related closure, days of virtual or remote instruction commensurate with in-person instruction will count towards the district's 180-day requirement. *Teaneck Public Schools may be confronted with the incidence of COVID-19 positive cases amongst staff and/or students.* If the district is required to exclude a student, group of students, a class, or multiple classes as a result of the scenarios listed above, while the school itself remains open for in-person instruction, Teaneck Public Schools should be prepared to offer virtual or remote instruction to those students in a manner commensurate with in-person instruction to the extent possible. In circumstances when the school facilities remain open and in-person instruction continues in those classrooms that are not required to quarantine, those days in session will also count towards the district's 180-day requirement in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9.2.
