FDU Recognition

This evening, we are recognizing 24 students and 4 teachers who participated in the district's Fairleigh Dickinson University Summer Middle College/Dual Enrollment Program which took place virtually June 28 through July 30, 2021. In this program, Teaneck High School students had an opportunity to earn college credits by registering for 1 dual enrollment course to earn 3 college credits and 5 THS elective credits. This is the third year in a row that we have offered this outstanding opportunity for our students. This year's summer courses were Financial Planning, World Cultures, Introduction to Psychology and Introduction to Creative Writing. Congratulations to all of our students, and a special thank you to our teaching staff and our partners at FDU.

COVID-19 Update

As I mentioned at the Workshop Meeting, we are averaging 3 - 5 student cases and 1 - 2 staff cases per week. The good news is that Teaneck and New Jersey's overall rates have come down; but the State is expecting another rise in cases from Thanksgiving through the holiday season. To that end, I will be issuing a communication to all staff notifying them of some other changes in our gathering protocols as well as opportunities for vaccines, booster shots, flu shots, and COVID testing. Our Back to School Nights - including the final ones for Thomas Jefferson and Benjamin Franklin Middle Schools this evening - took place in a fully remote/virtual environment.

It appears that within the next few weeks, Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine could be approved for children ages 5 to 11. Children 12 and older are already eligible to receive this vaccine. As we continue collaborating with our local partners - Holy Name Medical Center and the Teaneck Health Department - we issued a brief survey on Friday asking our families to let us know their thoughts about having their children vaccinated. This survey was issued in English and Spanish and we received the following responses: *Total Responses:*

- 520 (includes participation from every school and grade)
- Survey Questions/Responses:
 - My 12-18 year old child has already received the COVID-19 vaccination:
 - o 68% YES
 - Once eligible, my 5-11 year old child will receive the COVID-19 vaccination as quickly as possible:
 - o 48% YES
 - If you plan to have your child vaccinated for COVID-19, which is your preference for a vaccination venue/location?

 55% NO PREFERENCE; 26.2% DOCTOR OR PHARMACY; 12% RODDA CENTER; 7% CHILD'S SCHOOL

Also, if your child has received the COVID-19 vaccination, please don't forget to upload your child's vaccination card to have this information with your school nurse in case of any need to quarantine. Vaccination Card Upload.

Technology Department

During the start of the 2020-2021 school year, the Technology Department successfully deployed our new laptops to all teachers. The new, more robust devices, should assist our teachers with providing high quality content to all of our students. Additionally, these devices help us progress through our Strategic Plan goals around creating a classroom standard for technology throughout the district.

The Technology Department also assisted during the Start Strong assessment and worked alongside building administrators to ensure all students have access to a working device.

During the week of October 4, the Technology Department issued a survey requesting information about device and internet access at home. With 667 responses, we learned that 31% of our families do not have a personal device that can provide virtual learning, and 12% of our families do not have

internet services at home. These results will help us better assess what our families need, and how best we can serve them. These survey results will also help us receive additional funding from the FCC's Emergency Connectivity Fund to purchase additional devices and hotspots for our students and families.


