Special Recognition

I am pleased to announce that one of our students was among the winners of the Inaugural Bergen County Sheriff's Youth Writing Contest. Joseph Cecchini, a 5th grade student at Thomas Jefferson Middle School, has been selected as one of this year's awardees. Anthony Cureton, Bergen County Sheriff, hosted an award ceremony today; but I have also invited Joseph to join us this evening so we can recognize his wonderful accomplishment.

Return to School Plan for Second Marking Period

This evening, we are presenting our "Return to School Plan" for the second marking period (which begins in mid-November). I want to stress that this presentation is the current framework for how we plan to proceed with a "phased in" approach to bring our children back into their school buildings. However, we will not finalize these plans until I have completed my upcoming parent, student and staff focus groups over the next week and half. Also, these plans assume no major changes in COVID-19 numbers over this next month – to a point where such returns are not possible. We will proceed with finalizing this plan over the next two weeks.

New District Office

Now that we have officially opened our Theodora Smiley Lacey School – the site of our old district offices – I am pleased to announce the opening of our new District Office building at 651 Teaneck Road (right in front of Thomas Jefferson Middle School). This office building includes the Superintendent's Office as well as our Business, Human Resources and Special Education offices. Additionally, we are relocating our Registration and Community Education departments to this new building. However, while our district staff will be working in these offices, we are still in a pandemic and are strongly encouraging the community to reach out to all district departments by email or by phone. Visitors will be limited to advance appointments. This is a very exciting time for our district and we are looking forward to our special ribbon-cutting ceremony next week.

Free Meal Extension & Introducing Weekend Meals

I want to remind all of our families that we have a weekly meal distribution program that is available to all district students under the age of 18; and we are now pleased to announce that we are providing meals for the weekend as well (which began on Friday, October 9, 2020).

Additionally, we have received great news that the USDA is extending the current <u>free</u> meal programs until June 30, 2021 (which also provides an extension of current SFSP and SSO meal programs at no cost to students and allows parents and guardians to pick-up meals for their children). Week of Respect

The New Jersey Anti-Bullying H.I.B. Legislation has designated the first week of October as the "Week of Respect" across the state of New Jersey. In our current remote learning environment and in accordance with the law, our schools have participated via google classroom meetings in various activities which emphasized the importance of making good choices, being respectful and being an "upstander."





All schools began the week with daily announcements with poems, quotes, songs and tips about Social Emotional Learning. All homeroom teachers introduced the Week of Respect Choice Boards and reviewed activities (e.g. Respect Boards, "Things we should do more often", and H.I.B. Slideshow and virtual presentations) for use throughout this past week. Students were engaged and participated in writing poems, songs, and letters about respect, acceptance, and inclusion. They also made virtual collages and each day was a theme day. Additionally, to honor "National Stomp Out Bullying Day" on October 5, all students and faculty wore blue. Ms. Adrienne Williams, our district's HIB coordinator, will post resources on the website where students and families can access them for future reference.

Curriculum & Instruction

Instructional Resources

Curriculum Supervisors spent the last month equipping instructional practitioners with resources and materials for teaching remotely. During the month of September, students throughout the district received new textbooks, reading materials, hands-on learning materials and new online resources to ensure that all students have a second-to-none learning experience. In support of these materials, curriculum supervisors have been working diligently with teachers to model the effective use of these materials. Padlet, Google Meets and KAMI are among some of our newer online platforms. The Curriculum and Instruction team is confident that we will be able to boost the virtual learning experience with these tools in hand!

English Language Learners:

The district's ESL team has been actively identifying and screening students who are in need of language support. In an effort to support both students and families, the ESL team will be hosting an online webinar that will be translated into Spanish and Urdu that will explain the use of Google Classroom. The webinar will include explanations on the use of Skyward, the district's student information system, and useful information about school-related procedures such as the Chromebook Deport and lunch distribution. We are excited to meet our bilingual families in November and we are looking forward to another positive family event!

Special Services

Intervention and Referral Services (I&RS) Leadership Team Update - Leadership Retreat

The overall goal of the Teaneck Public School District MTSS/I&RS program is to provide students who are struggling to meet the demands of the English Language Arts, mathematics curricula, and social-emotional challenges with targeted research-based interventions to meet their individual learning and or social-emotional needs. During the leadership retreat, the department of special education provided the team with an update and plan on NJ State Regulations on Response to Intervention (RTI), appropriate instructions, screenings, written notifications to parents/guardians and much more.



18-21 Postgraduate Virtual Meet & Greet - 9/1/2020

A virtual Meet & Greet was held for our 18-21 postgraduate students, parents, and staff. The focus of this meeting was on the South Bergen Jointure Commission partnership – including a virtual tour of the Lodi Campus.

Behavioral Disabilities Virtual Lunch Meet & Greet - 9/4/2020

To assist our students in the behavioral disabilities grade 5-6 program transition to the 2020-2021 school year, a virtual lunch meeting was facilitated for students, parents, teachers, school counselors, related services providers and administrators. We addressed the following:

- Introduction of Teaneck Public Schools and South Bergen Jointure Commission Administration and Staff
- Program Overview/Partnership
- Remote Learning via Teaneck Public Schools Remote Learning Plan

Special Education Teachers and Paraprofessional Supporting Students Remotely PD - 9/2/ - 9/4/2020 PD sessions were held for elementary, middle, and high school special education teachers and paraprofessionals on the following topics:

- Verbal de-escalation and crisis prevention strategies during remote instruction;
- Paraprofessional expectations during virtual learning;
- Instructional supports;
- Coordinating with the classroom teacher to ensure staff and paras are using approved curriculum materials and content;
- Maintaining confidentiality and professionalism during virtual instruction.

IEP Direct Training for all special education teachers, child study team members, and related services providers - 9/2/2020 - 9/4/2020

To ensure all new and returning teachers, child study team case managers, and related services providers are equipped with the skills and knowledge to maintain IEP compliance, the department facilitated training sessions for all special education teachers, child study team case managers, and related services providers across the district on topics ranging from navigating the IEP Direct platform to compliance reports.

IEP Best Practices - The Little Blue Book PD - 9/9/2020

To continually evaluate and refine the effective practices of our special education staff, the department facilitated an interactive PD session that provided practical guidance on a wide range of topics including "Details and mandates of Initials and Re-evaluations" to "Consent & Student Records". We also focused on the IEP best practices and the nuances of remote learning.

Special Education Parent Advisory Group (SEPAG) Committee Meeting - 09/22/2020

The mission of the Teaneck Special Education Parental Advisory Group (SEPAG) is to facilitate proactive collaboration and honest communication among parents, students, staff, the Teaneck Board of Education, and the community. To that end, we continue to develop and sustain a supportive partnership to ensure the delivery of appropriate services for our students with special needs. The Teaneck SEPAG Committee met virtually on Tuesday, September 22, 2020, to discuss the following:

- Security grant what means for our kids? Drill training for staff to get to know our kids.
- Clubs and sports opportunities for special education students during virtual learning.
- Virtual therapy- what's working/what's not?



- Parent workshops this year building a calendar of events
- Planned improvements for the continued virtual learning environment smaller classes, 1:1 aides at the students' home.
- How can we help ensure special education students have the assistive technology they need at home (touch screens, larger screens, etc.) during virtual learning?

Upcoming Programs/Events

- I&RS Training for Committee Members Building-based I&RS committee members will be guiding I&RS teams on the I&RS process, timelines, and implementation of the *HIPstervention* program.
- The Little Blue Book for Respective Disciplines Follow up sessions on IEP best practices with Little Blue Book for Speech therapists, LDTCs, Psychologists, and Social Workers will be scheduled with each discipline team in the upcoming weeks.

Communications, Community Relations & Volunteer Services

Internal & External Communications Plan

Per Ms. Corallo's June 2020 Board presentation of the district's go-forward Internal & External Communications Plan, she has been working on several components of the Plan including:

- New Brand Initiative a new district logo featuring the District's Strategic Plan Vision Statement (The Teaneck Advantage: Educational Excellence for All) has been created and implemented; other key components of the Brand Identity Guidelines are nearly finalized (e.g. business cards, form headers, email signatures, PowerPoint templates, etc.)
- District Website Redesign A survey went out to all parents/guardians seeking their input on the current website home page and parent section. Over 500 parents responded to the survey and parent focus groups will be held the week of October 26. The information gathered will be used to begin the redesign phase of these two core sections. Per Phase I of the Plan, these are expected to launch by spring 2021. Phase II includes the Board, Staff and Student sections.

Special Events

- Theodora Smiley Lacey Grand Opening held on September 17 and featured Mrs. Lacey as our honoree and guest speaker. The day began with a motorcade down Teaneck Road where the community cheered for Mrs. Lacey prior to the official ceremony. Due to the pandemic, specific health and safety guidelines were closely followed. Other guest speakers included the Bergen Chapter of the NAACP, the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and many town, county and state elected officials. The event received media coverage on ABC NY, News 12, The Record and more. This school is now officially open for the district's kindergarten population.
- New District Office Grand Opening a small ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held on October 22. The new District office is officially open for business.

Community Education's Drop-in & SACC Programs

The District has created and launched its "Drop-in Program" – a free service that we are offering for limited number of families in need (e.g. McKinney Vento or essential workers). The purpose of this program is for participating students to follow their set school schedule under adult supervision (as their parents are not able to be home with them to monitor their remote/virtual learning.) The children have been placed at either Bryant or Whittier School and bring their Chromebooks to take part in their virtual



classroom instruction (with their teacher). These children are provided with breakfast and lunch - and they have recess per their school schedules. After this program concludes at 3 pm, the rooms are fully sanitized and we begin the SACC afterschool care program (at Bryant only) – which is a "paid for" service available to all district families. We are currently reviewing options for the second marking period but this will depend upon the district's go-forward "Return to School" plan. More information will be forthcoming.

Technology

During the summer months as well as the start of the school year, the Technology Department has worked diligently on getting the district ready for remote learning. In August and September, we had our Chrome Depot open for distribution where we provided Chromebooks to all grades PreK to 12. We will continue to provide support to our staff and students during remote learning through the Chrome Depot. Monthly schedules are posted on the district website. Parents/guardians and students, if you experience any tech difficulties please email techhelp@teaneckschools.org and a member of the Technology Department will assist you.

Now that students and teachers have become accustomed to more online resources and tools we have increased the bandwidth to continue to provide high-quality internet access ready to be used when students and teachers return to school.

The Technology Department facilitated a number of professional development opportunities for families and staff. In August, we provided training sessions for our parents to learn about Google Classroom and other Google tools that are being used for remote learning. Additionally, we facilitated training for all staff prior to the opening of school. The training provided a number of tools and resources for our faculty and staff to use to enhance the remote learning experience.
