COVID-19 Update

I want to assure our families that while the number of COVID cases in New Jersey is up over the past two weeks, and the transmission level in Bergen County moved to "High" (Orange) last week, we are not seeing a significant increase in cases in our schools. In fact, over the past two weeks, we have averaged 1 - 3 new cases per school. I also spoke to the acting Teaneck Health Officer and she indicated that mask optional currently remains the practice in Hackensack and all other Bergen County school districts.

We only close a classroom if we have three or more students in one classroom who test positive within the five days of the first positive test.
