Black History Month

February is designated as "Black History Month" and our district is celebrating - and educating - on this annual event in many ways. COVID-19 Update

Mask Requirement: NJ Governor Murphy recently announced that effective March 7, all schools and child care centers in New Jersey can remove the mask requirement when inside the school buildings but also noted that the final decision on this can be made at the school district level. To that end, and per the discussion that took place at last week's Board meeting, the district has released (via email) a parent, staff, and student survey to hear everyone's thoughts on this topic. This input along with guidance from our local health department and school physicians, will be used as we make a decision on whether to lift this restriction or make any other changes in our COVID-19 protocols. It should be noted that school buses follow federal regulations and the mask mandate will not be lifted yet on school buses. We hope everyone will participate in this survey which is due on Monday, February 21 by 8 pm.

Curriculum & Instruction

Visual and Performing Arts

- A number of our fine arts students in grades 1-12 are participating in this year's national art contest sponsored by The Bergen County Chapter of Links, Inc. titled "The Art of Social Justice to Transform Communities." Students are encouraged to reflect and artistically express the work of social justice leaders and their impact on their community. Classroom discussions will be centered around issues like equal rights, violence and racial justice.
- In addition, on February 5th, the beautiful sounds of music filled Whittier Elementary school by our amazing students at our first ever Fourth Grade Saturday Instrumental Music Program. On May 21, 2022, these young instrumentalists will perform and showcase their hard work for their friends and families to conclude the program.

Computer Science Department

The Teaneck High School Computer Science Department is proud to announce that 5 of our 10th and 11th grade computer science students have been selected by the Fairleigh Dickinson University Gildart Haase School of Computer Sciences & Engineering (GHSCSE) to attend a level one computer science course on the Python Programming Language. The students will be attending the course for 15 weeks on Saturdays and upon completing the course successfully, the students will earn 3 college credits at no cost to the students.

Science Department

To celebrate and honor Black History Month, all **Teaneck High School** science classes are highlighting the contributions that Black Scientists have made in recent and past history. From the first treatment for leprosy to the foundation of the global positioning system, Black scientists have long been involved in major scientific developments, despite being pushed to the margins, refused jobs, and denied credit for their discoveries. The Teaneck High School science teachers are taking opportunities to share and celebrate

- the Black Scientists that have contributed to their science subject as well as their current unit of study.
- All science teachers from Thomas Jefferson Middle School and Benjamin Franklin Middle School are taking part in a Door Decorating Contest that will honor and acknowledge the great contributions that Black Scientists have made in the past and continue to make today. The door decorations will display multiple Black Scientists, a small bio of each as well as the contributions that those scientists made and in many cases continue to make today. There is a decorative design component to the contest and a winning prize will be awarded to the best design.
- The Science Department has provided the opportunity for eleven science teachers ranging from grades K through 12 to attend professional development sessions offered by The Science Education Institute at Raritan Valley Community College. This Profession Development Series focuses on the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) and how to support students as they Investigate Phenomena and use Phenomena to guide the science instruction. The workshop sessions model what NGSS-aligned instruction looks like in the science classroom and lab. The teachers that attend also turnkey what is presented to the rest of the science teaching staff. The first of these turnkey opportunities came on December 6th, 2021 Professional Development Day and will continue as the year progresses. Moreover, some school administrators have been leveraging the staff that have attended the workshops and have allowed them to present their training to the respective building teaching staff as in the case of Whittier Elementary School.
- The 7th and 8th grade science teachers from both **Benjamin Franklin Middle School** and **Thomas Jefferson Middle School**, in partnership with **The Nation Environmental Education Foundation (NEEF)**, participated in the Teaneck Watershed STEM Launch Event on Thursday February 10, 2022. This event initiated a number of activities that all 7th and 8th grade science students will allow them to learn science not only in the classroom but also study the real world impact on the environment in our community. Every Wednesday during this period, the students will be taking part in "Watershed Wednesdays." During the "Watershed Wednesdays" science activities, the students will be studying science related to water quality as well as macroinvertebrates. These activities will lead to a field trip to the Teaneck Creek where the students will be able to apply what they have learned in the classroom and generate data driven lab reports. The final activity will be a culminating project to showcase their work and findings.

English/ Language Arts

Elementary students will be participating in The National 33rd African American Read-In hosted by The National Council for Teachers of English (NCTE). As the website notes, "During the month of February, schools, churches, libraries, bookstores, community and professional organizations, and interested citizens are urged to make literacy a significant part of Black History Month by hosting an African American Read-In. Hosting an event can be as simple as bringing together friends to share a book or as elaborate as arranging public readings and media presentations that feature professional African American writers. It was established in 1990 by the Black Caucus of the National Council of Teachers of English to make literacy a significant part of Black History Month.
