#### **Curriculum & Instruction**

Revised New Jersey Student Learning Standards:

The New Jersey Student Learning Standards (NJSLS) are reviewed and revised every five years. On June 3, 2020, the State Board of Education adopted new standards for the following areas:

- Career Readiness
- Health and Physical Education
- Computer Science
- Visual and Performing Arts
- World Language
- Social Studies

#### As per The NJDOE website, the update includes:

- Climate change across all content areas, leveraging the passion students have shown for this critical issue and providing them opportunities to develop a deep understanding of the science behind the changes and to explore the solutions our world desperately needs;
- Computer programming in all grade bands K-12, ensuring all students receive a 22nd century
  education in the critical computational thinking skills that are the underpinning of so much of
  our work and so many of our transactions; and
- National standards for science and visual and performing arts, ensuring access to, and opportunity in, science and the arts, for every New Jersey public student.

#### Summer Curriculum Writing

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction is busily planning for the next school year. This summer, we have 52 curriculum projects taking place. All content supervisors will be engaging with their respective teams to write and revise new curriculum guides, draft new pacing calendars and plan for instruction for the 2020 school year. We are excited to begin this work since these guides will now utilize the newly adopted standards set forth by the New Jersey Department of Education.

#### Summer Bridge Program

In addition, we are excited to begin our Summer Bridge Program. We have hired over 40 teachers who will engage in distance learning experiences over the month of July. Our STEM projects for our elementary learners will be distributed on July 1st and 2nd. Teachers will be formally trained on the first two days in preparation for instruction. We will kick-off our distance learning teaching schedule on Monday, July 6, 2020.

#### Science Data

The district's science results were released earlier this school year. After reviewing the data, The Department of Curriculum and Instruction, under the leadership of our Science Supervisor, Mr. Rolando Monserrat, has put together a comprehensive go-forward plan to ensure that our students are prepared to be scientific-thinkers. Teaneck School District Special Education Parent Advisory Group (SEPAG)

SEPAG hosted its final meeting for the 2019-2020 school year on Tuesday June 16, 2020. Agenda items were generated by parents and included:

### Extended School Year Program (ESY) June 22, 2020 - August 3, 2020

Extended School Year services are designed to support a student with a disability as documented under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) to maintain the academic, social/behavioral, communication, or other skills that they have learned as part of their Individualized Education Program (IEP). Virtual ESY will begin on Monday, June 22 through Monday, August 3. The program runs Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM. ESY will not be in session on Friday, July 3. In the virtual model, ESY Teachers will provide a minimum of two hours of live instruction. This will be a combination of recorded lessons, small group instruction, reading intervention services and related services based on the needs and levels of the students.

Before school and after school shifts available (part-time only). Hourly rates start at \$12/hour.
