Student & Staff Recognition

Prior to this meeting, we held a special reception for our most recent district retirees and for Mr. Vincent McHale, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum & Instruction, who we wish the very best in his new role as Superintendent of Closter.

End of Year Memo

I have attached my "End of Year" memo that will go out to our Teaneck families. This memo includes the highlights of the many accomplishments of the past year and I promise that the best is yet to come!

District Strategic Plan

This evening, Ms. Patricia Dent, Supervisor of ELA/ESL and Strategic Plan Co-Chair, and I will be presenting our new District Strategic Plan. This plan will be posted on our website and will be the blueprint to guide our district forward for the next five years.

Leadership Training

On June 25 – 27, I will be conducting Leadership Training for our Executive Team, principals, directors, supervisors and assistant principals. The majority of this training will be focused on the Institute for Learning (IFL). We will also introduce the newest members of our leadership team, discuss diversity & inclusion, and take part in a team-building exercise.

Transition to Insight/Paraprofessionals

According to Human Resources, we have 102 full day paraprofessionals who are in the classroom and/or attached to a student with an IEP. As of June 14, we had 88 sign up out of 102 or 87%. An additional 20 para's came in to meet our team on Monday at our Eugene Field location. Additionally, approximately 15 people who were not part of the current para program attended one of the sessions over the last week. The Insight team also met with the principals and secretaries on June 17 to introduce their program and processes.

P.R.I.D.E. Month

In honor of P.R.I.D.E. month, and at the request of a Town Council member, Dr. Amy Moran, who oversees the district's Spectrum program, attended the June 18 Teaneck Town Council Meeting. A few students attended the meeting with her and she shared information regarding the Spectrum program. Spectrum is considered a Gender and Sexuality Alliance (GSA) in support of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer/questioning, asexual, and gender nonbinary (LGBTIQA+) students and--by extension--LGBTIQA+ teachers, administrators, family members, and the greater Teaneck community.

Since 2007, each April, Spectrum hosts "Ally Week', during which Spectrum participants invite members of the THS community to take the Ally Week Pledge. By taking this pledge, allies agree to 1.) Not use anti-LGBTIQA+ language and 2.) Stand up for anyone being bullied if they can safely do so. On Friday of Ally Week, Spectrum hosts the Day of Silence, which is a nation-wide, school-based, social-justice action in schools, first launched in 1996, and which takes place in April. On the Day of Silence, participants take

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a vow of silence for the day to symbolize the ways in which LGBTIQA+ people have been silence throughout history and across cultures by exclusion from things like protective legislation, social practices, and even school curricula.

FDU & TPS Summer Dual Enrollment Program

I am pleased to announce approximately 40 students have signed up to take advantage of our latest collaborative college program – the Fairleigh Dickinson University & Teaneck Public Schools Dual Enrollment Summer Program. As previously reported, through this program, Teaneck High School students (grades 9 – 12) will have the ability to take up to four FDU college courses at our high school for only \$250 per course. This offer was also made available to our non-public high school students at a slightly higher price – but still a significant savings.

Pre-K Grant for 2019-2020

Preparation is well underway for our third preschool location (with a contracted provider - AUCC Academy) to be ready for the grand opening in September. AUCC plans to host an Open House event in mid-August. Meantime, we have completed pre-k registrations for 138 new students who will participate this fall. Each family provided their order of preference for placement at one of our three locations and final placement letters will be sent out in August. For families who do not receive an acceptance letter, their child's name will be placed on our waitlist.

Superintendent's Advisory Committees

Curriculum & Instruction

The Assistant Superintendent submitted the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Consolidated Grants for Title I, IIA, III, and IV and Title I Reallocated grants. The total amount of these entitlement grants is \$ \$864,532.

The C&I supervisors will be working with teachers on curriculum writing projects this summer. There will be thirty-five curriculum documents that will be revised or created.

Community Relations & Volunteer Services

We are pleased to announce that over 180 kindergarten and 136 pre-k students are now registered for the 2019-2020 school year. Kindergarten enrollment lists have been sent to their respective schools. We are now working toward completion of the nursing portion of our registration process for pre-k. Also, Camp Kookooskoos began on June 24 with 167 camp participants (up by about 30 students from last year). The summer camp program runs through August 2. Other notable current projects include:

• Participation in recent athletic awards and honors ceremonies, as well as all moving-up and high school graduation ceremonies to post pictures on district Facebook page

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- Superintendent Video messages the third video was released on June 4th focused on the district's summer offerings and inviting everyone to the Strategic Plan presentation on June 26
- Teacher of the Year Reception over 50 people attended this special reception on June 12
- Retiree & Best Wishes Reception planning for this special event held this evening (June 26)
- Planning for this week's Leadership Training (June 25-27)
- The Superintendent issued letters on the following topics Camp Shalom Town Hall, New Principal Hires & Strategic Plan Presentation, and a special summer message to all staff. Dr. Irving also issued a district-wide phone call wishing everyone a wonderful summer and inviting everyone to tonight's Strategic Plan presentation.

Technology

The Technology Department is now preparing the Chromebooks for the 1:1 initiative in the high school. We have student interns who are working alongside the department to help set up and prepare the Chromebooks for students in September.

Additionally, the district-owned school bus now has a camera system as well as GPS tracking. This will help the transportation department to monitor the bus and to help keep our students safe. Over the summer, the technology department will be cleaning up technology throughout the district and preparing classrooms for when schools open in September.

Hawthorne Elementary School

• Mr. Jennette prepared the Hawthorne 2019 / 2020 Title I School Wide Grant and has been working with Ms. Pitt to smoothly transition her into the role as Hawthorne's new Principal.

Whittier Elementary School

Recent events/activities at Whittier include:

- During the month of June, students participated in a number of fun and academic events and celebrations.
- All grade levels held end-of-year celebrations. Kindergarten and grade 1 students performed a musical presentation entitled "Going Buggy." In addition, grade 1 classes held a luau. The students in grade 2 performed musical numbers, watch a video of each classes' George Street Playhouse performance and presented their writing and work accomplished throughout the year. Benjamin Franklin Middle School
