- Visual and Performing Arts -The Vocal Music Department at Teaneck High School will be hosting

In addition, Ms. Mack (THS Assistant Principal & Business Supervisor) and Mr. Sularz (Supervisor of Humanities & Gifted Education) met with Ms. Barbara Ostroth and Ms. Margot Fisher from the Teaneck League of Women's Voters about continuing the partnership and previously developed initiatives between Teaneck Public Schools and the Teaneck LWV.
- Gifted and Talented The Teaneck Academically Gifted and Talented Program is currently
 preparing for the introduction of in-person enrichment for Kindergarten classes during the
 month of February. In addition, teachers are currently engaged in curriculum writing for the 1st
 / 2nd Grade program as well as the Kindergarten program.
