February is Black History Month! Our students are involved in many lessons and activities to learn about the contributions of Black people in every field of human endeavor throughout history. Students at Lowell School presented their annual Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK) tribute assembly today to parents and the community. Hawthorne School will hold their annual MLK Assembly at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 28, 2017. Whittier School students will present their MLK assembly on Friday, March 17, 2017. At Benjamin Franklin Middle School the students are working on creating Black History Month exhibits which will be shown during a "Night at the Museum," date to be announced.

The Central Park Zoo visited Hawthorne School on Tuesday, February 7, 2017, to present "Polar Opposites!" This theatrical presentation taught students about the amazing wild things of the Artic and Antarctica.
