YOU NEED TO DO THIS TODAY!

Student feedback has proven that <u>procrastination</u> with the college application process has resulted in much higher stress levels for both students and parents! Completing most of your college applications workload over the summer will result in a smoother start to your senior year...and a much happier household. This month please take a moment to.....

- Create a Common Application Account. This preparation is required for this step so you can create your account as early as you'd like. All you'll need is some basic profile information--like your name, date of birth, address and phone number. And of course, you'll need to provide a valid email address. Click here to create your account:
 Common App Login. If your college does not appear under the Common Application, go directly to their website and click admissions for their own online application. Here are the step-by-step directions on how to complete the Common Application. Pdf
- 2. Begin drafting your college essay. **JUST GET STARTED!** Click here for some help: <u>Essay Help Tips</u> Here's some more <u>Essay Help!</u> The basic premise is to focus on ONE idea. If you could sit down with an admissions representative, what is the ONE thing you would want them to know about you? Be genuine and limit your essay to 1 ½ to 2 pages MAXIMUM! Common Application Essay Prompts 2021- 2022. Here are some websites to give you some inspiration: John Hopkins Essays That Work
- 3. Narrow down your school list in Naviance. The **MOST important** part of this entire process is applying to appropriate colleges! Summer was the ideal time to continue researching colleges, visiting colleges, and narrowing down your final list to include roughly 10 colleges. You want this process to be successful! A healthy guideline to follow consists of:

2 reach colleges 6 target colleges

2 likely colleges

- 4. Complete your "Junior Questionnaire" (About Me>>>My Surveys>>>Surveys Not Started) in Naviance, and, encourage your parent/guardian to complete the "Parent Questionnaire" (About Me>>>My Surveys>>>Surveys Not Started). The more information the counselor has, the better letter of recommendation he/she can write. If you need help with your Naviance login, please reach out to your counselor.
- 5. Start preparing your FAFSA: Financial Aid and think about how you plan to pay for college. Preparing for FAFSA

REQUESTING LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

- Step 1: If you haven't already done so, ask your teacher(s) if they will write a letter for you. Once they say "yes"....
- Step 2: Login to your Naviance Account
- Step 3: Click on "Colleges"
- Step 4: Click on "Letters of Recommendation"
- Step 5: Click "Add Request" and complete the form.
 - If you haven't added any colleges to your active list, you will need to do so as soon as possible.
 - When asked: "Select which colleges this request is for?" **Select: "All current and future colleges" Please reach out to your counselor with any questions.**

FINANCING YOUR FUTURE

How Financial Aid Works

For most students planning to attend college or career school, financial aid is essential. The U.S. Department of Education's office of Federal Student Aid provides more than \$120 billion in financial aid to help pay for college or career school each year.

Before each year of college, apply for federal grants, work-study, and loans with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form. Your college uses your FAFSA data to determine your federal aid eligibility. Many states and colleges use FAFSA data to award their own aid. After submission, you'll receive your Student Aid Report.

It's never too early—or too late—to explore your options for college or career school. Go to https://studentaid.gov/ to learn more about key steps in preparing for college and resources that can help you along the way.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

It's never too early to start thinking about how you are going to pay for college: In Naviance, go to Colleges...scroll to the bottom and click on "Scholarship List"...then change the Browse function by Category to "Search Engine." This will give you a list of places to begin your search. Looking for scholarships is very labor intensive, but worth it. **DO NOT pay for scholarship information or provide your Social Security number.** Also, always review the Teaneck High School Counseling Website periodically for updated information.

Leslie Jones, the founder of The Hundred-Seven, I work to 'share good news about HBCUs.' This year The Hundred-Seven is expanding its outreach and including a virtual HBCU Week in collaboration with Xi Omega Chapter, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. from February 27- March 4. The virtual HBCU Week has several components including a live-streamed event each night from 8:30-9:30 EST that will include conversations with HBCU alumni in different professional fields, highlights of HBCUs in different regions as well as specialty programs (community colleges, programs for vets and non-traditional students, programs for students with learning challenges) and scholarship presentations.

During the week there will also be a pop-up Facebook group where families and educators can ask questions and interact with representatives from colleges. Everyone who registers will receive an e-book that highlights the participating HBCUs and will be eligible for one of the scholarships that will be presented during the week.



POWERFUL WOMEN IN US HISTORY

Kamala Harris

In 2021, Harris was sworn in as the first woman and first woman of color vice president of the United States.

Jill Biden

First Lady. Her role continues as an educator. Her areas of interest include working with and advocating for military families, highlighting the importance of community college education, and women's issues ranging from breast cancer prevention and gender equality in the US and abroad.

Susan Rice

Domestic Policy Council Leader and Former National Security Advisor to President Obama.

Kristen Clarke

Nominee for Assistant Attorney General for the civil rights division of the Department of Justice by Joe Biden.

Nancy Pelosi

Speaker of the United States House of Representatives from 2002 to now.

Kathrin Jansen

Head of Vaccine Research and Development at Pfizer from 2020 to now. The race to find the first effective and safe vaccine for coronavirus captured the nation's attention in 2020, and one of the most powerful players in the search for the vaccine was none other than Kathrin Jansen.

Queen Elizabeth II

Monarch of the United Kingdom. She's the longest-reigning monarch in British History. Queen Elizabeth II has held a place of power on the world stage for 70 years (2022 milestone year) and was crowned on June 2, 1953.

Greta Thunberg

Climate Activist—young swedish activist (18 yrs old) has started a worldwide movement for climate change and is undoubtedly one of the most powerful female forces in the world today.

Melinda Gates

Co-Founder of the William H. Gates Foundation with the goal of placing computers and Microsoft products in libraries across the country. Melinda Gates is a powerhouse in her own right. The charitable foundation seeks to improve education and help solve global poverty and health issues. In 2012, Melinda donated a whopping \$560 million towards efforts to increase access to contraception for women in developing countries.

Oprah Winfrey

Media Executive, Actrice, TV Producer and Philanthropist

Oprah Winfrey is best known for her award-winning talk show, "The Oprah Winfrey Show." Winfrey's personable interviewing style continued to attract viewers, as did her two most famous segments, "Oprah's Book Club" and "Oprah's Favorite Things." Oprah was the first black female billionaire and became a generous philanthropist. Winfrey has

advocated for girls' education across the world and Oprah's Angel Network has raised more than \$50 million for charitable programs.

Susan Wojcicki

CEO of YouTube. Formerly Google's senior vice president in charge of marketing, Susan Wojcicki has served as video-sharing website YouTube's CEO since 2014, the longest-tenured CEO in the history of the website. Wojcicki now leads YouTube, which reportedly has more than one billion monthly users.

Shonda Rhimes

Award-Winning Writer and Producer. She is the creator of "Grey's Anatomy," the longest-running medical drama on television. Premiering in 2005, the show is currently in its 17th season and won Rhimes a Golden Globe for best television series. Rhimes is also the creator of "Scandal," which aired for seven seasons, "How to Get Away With Murder," and the 2021 drama series "Bridgerton." Rhimes is a supporter and co-creator of the Times Up movement, which seeks to promote gender equality at studios and talent agencies and to pressure lawmakers into introducing legislation that would penalize companies that tolerate persistent sexual or gender-based harassment.

Alexndria Ocasio-Cortez

Representative for New York's 14th Congressional District. She's often referred to as AOC. She is the youngest woman to ever be elected to Congress and is an active member of the Democratic Socialists of America and a Bernie Sanders supporter. She is also a proponent and co-author of the "Green New Deal," a congressional resolution that aims to provide a resolution to climate change. During her term as a congresswoman, Ocasio-Cortez has spoken out on hot-button issues like abortion and border control, as well as cybersecurity and climate change.

Amy Ruth Tan

An American-Chinese bestselling author known for the novel *The Joy Luck Club,* which was adapted into a film of the same name in 1993 by director Wayne Wang.

Tan has written several other novels, including *The Kitchen God's Wife, The Hundred Secret Senses, The Bonesetter's Daughter, Saving Fish from Drowning,* and *The Valley of Amazement*. Tan's latest book is a memoir entitled *Where The Past Begins: A Writer's Memoir* (2017). In addition to these, Tan has written two children's books: *The Moon Lady* (1992) and *Sagwa, the Chinese Siamese Cat* (1994), which was turned into an animated series that aired on PBS.

Cecilia Chung

An Asian American Civil Rights Leader and Activist for LGBTQ rights, HIV/Aids awareness and health advocacy. As a transgender activist who as spent decades fighting for the rights and protections for transgender people and people living with HIV/Aids, she has received "Love Letters" to Movement Leader from younger generations of trans activists. Thanking Cecilia for inspiration and the fact that she's tough as nails and a tireless advocate for marginalized communities.

Sonia Maria Sotomayor

An associate justice of the Supreme Court of the United States. She was nominated and appointed by President Barack Obama on May 26, 2009 and has served since August 8, 2009. She is the third woman to hold the position. Sotomayor is the first woman of color, first Hispanic, and first Latina member of the Court.

Sotomayor was born in The Bronx, New York City, to Puerto Rican-born parents. She is known as **the fearless federal trial court judge** who saved Major League Baseball from a ruinous 1995 strike.

Deb Anne Haaland

The 54th US Secretary Of The Interior, Deb Haaland made history when she became the first Native American to serve as a cabinet secretary. She is a member of the Pueblo of Laguna and a 35th generation New Mexican.

Haaland's appointment is significant, not simply because she is the first Native American cabinet member, but also because the Interior Department oversees the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Bureau of Indian Education. For much of US history, Native Americans viewed the Interior Department as a hostile entity because it worked against the interests of Native Americans. The department oversees public lands, including Native American lands, and it improperly tracked the

income generated by those lands and did not distribute the money properly to Native American tribes. Many hope that Secretary Haaland will be able to improve the department's relationship with Native Americans.



SEL4US and the Urban Assembly invite schools and communities around the globe to celebrate the importance of social emotional learning (SEL) on the third annual International SEL Day on Friday, March 11, 2022. **This year's theme is "Finding Common Ground, Pursuing Common Good."**



Irish- American Heritage Month is recognised in March every year as a way of honoring the achievements and contributions of Irish immigrants and their descendants living in the United States.

The US Congress designated March as Irish American Heritage Month in 1991 with the President of the United States issuing a proclamation each year since 1991.

The month of March was the chosen month so as to coincide with St Patrick's Day, the Roman Catholic Religious Holiday and Irish National Holiday held on March 17th. Each year in March, the Irish Taoiseach visits the United States for Saint Patrick's Day. A Shamrock Ceremony takes place in the morning at the White House where a crystal bowl containing a shamrock, a traditional symbol of Ireland, is presented to the President in the Oval Office. The luncheon is attended by the President, Vice President, the Taoiseach, the Speaker, and other officials. In the evening, a Saint Patrick's Day Reception takes place at the White House

Irish-American Heritage Month is a great opportunity to celebrate the nearly 33 million Americans with Irish ancestry and their tremendous contributions to the country.
