It is a thrill and delight to bring greetings to our extraordinary community. Undoubtedly, Teaneck Public Schools are committed to the educational excellence of all scholars. Although we are not perfect, we truly aim to create an environment that is attentive, responsive, and committed to our stakeholders. We want the inclusive environment that we pursue to create a safe and conducive school district and community. For this reason, we encourage each of you to join us in our efforts to unite our school communities.

In hopes of encouraging you to become a partner in the work of educating our scholars, I would like to share a few accomplishments:

- We have established an Early College High School program that encourages the participation of all learners.
- We have organized multiple groups of 25 scholars to participate in Togetherness and Belonging: Safe Spaces for All training sessions with the NJ Division on Civil Rights.
- We have established an International Baccalaureate World School program at Whittier Elementary School and a Health Science Magnet program at Hawthorne Elementary School.
- We have arranged scholar-centered mediation sessions to discuss respect, acceptance, and conflict resolution.
- We have held numerous musical performances displaying the diverse talents and accomplishments of our scholars.

These accomplishments are possible because of the dedication and commitment of adults like you. For this reason, I want to say, "Thank You!"

As I stated in this letter, we are not perfect. Nonetheless, I strongly believe that we are better together.

60 Year Anniversary Integration

The 60th anniversary of the integration of Teaneck Township, NJ, marks a significant event in the history of civil rights in the United States. On May 13, 1964, Teaneck made history by becoming the first community in the United States to desegregate its public schools through a community-led effort voluntarily.

Before this milestone, Teaneck, like many other communities across the nation, struggled with racial segregation in its schools and society at large. However, in the early 1960s, fueled by the burgeoning civil rights movement and a growing awareness of racial injustice, Teaneck residents from diverse backgrounds came together to challenge the status quo and advocate for change.

The integration movement gained momentum. Led by a coalition of concerned citizens, including parents, educators, clergy members, and activists, it worked tirelessly to promote racial harmony and equality in Teaneck through grassroots organizing, advocacy campaigns, and community dialogue.

One of the pivotal moments in this journey occurred on May 13, 1964, when the Teaneck Board of Education officially voted to implement a voluntary integration plan for its public schools. This groundbreaking decision was met with praise and criticism, reflecting the complex dynamics surrounding issues of race and education during that era.

The integration process was not without challenges, as it required overcoming deep-seated prejudices, institutional resistance, and logistical hurdles. However, the collective determination and collaboration of Teaneck residents prevailed, setting an inspiring example for other communities striving for racial integration and social justice.

The integration of Teaneck's schools marked a significant step forward in the fight against racial segregation and discrimination, illustrating the power of grassroots activism and community solidarity in effecting positive change. It serves as a reminder of the ongoing struggle for racial equality and the importance of upholding the principles of inclusivity, diversity, and justice in our society.
