Students at Lowell School presented their annual Martin Luther King, Jr. (MLK) tribute assembly today to parents and the community. Hawthorne School will hold their annual MLK Assembly at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 28, 2017. Whittier School students will present their MLK assembly on Friday, March 17, 2017. At Benjamin Franklin Middle School the students are working on creating Black History Month exhibits which will be shown during a "Night at the Museum," date to be announced.

The Central Park Zoo visited Hawthorne School on Tuesday, February 7, 2017, to present "Polar Opposites!" This theatrical presentation taught students about the amazing wild things of the Artic and Antarctica. Also on February 7th, the PTA provided every family and staff member with a copy of *Friendship According to Humphrey* by Betty G. Birney. The entire school community will be reading a few pages of this book each night and will then will then answer trivia questions and have discussions about the book's themes of friendship, family, forgiveness and problem-solving.

Whittier School is hosting a Family Math Night on Thursday, February 23, 2017. During this event, parents and students will engage in fun math activities. Parents will learn ways to support and continue math learning at home. More information will be available on the Whittier School website.

Application for Approval of a Proposed Research Project by a Teaneck Employee

State the purpose of the research project: The purpose of this study is to measure the current perceptions that teachers, students, and parents hold regarding a Northern New Jersey secondary school counseling program. When held against common themes matching the guidelines developed by the American School Counselor Association (ASCA), an analysis of these stakeholders' perceptions reveals particular strategies for secondary school counselor professional development training. These ASCA guidelines offer an important framework to chart certain academic, personal/social, and post-secondary planning milestones that students should be achieving in high school. From the study's data via surveys, interviews, and focus groups on stakeholders' perceptions, the researcher will design professional development for school counselors based on findings to address the needs identified in the study. The study aims to assist secondary school counselors on better communicating the scope of their services to teachers, students, and parents.

Detailed description of the research project: This study will employ surveys, interviews, and focus groups of teachers, students, and parents in the District's secondary school. All school counselors in the District are licensed professionals but are not required to follow the ASCA National Model® framework. Based on the results of the teachers', students', and parents' data from the surveys, interviews, and focus groups, the researcher will design professional development training materials for school counselors and conduct the professional development training. School counselors will receive pre- and post-tests to measure where they were prior to the professional development training and any growth resulting from the professional development training. The College of Saint Elizabeth's Institutional Research Board will approve all surveys, interview questions, focus group questions and pre-/post-test questions prior to anyone receiving them. All individuals—teachers, students, parents, and school counselors— will receive detailed information about each instrument tool and must consent to participate. Should a person decide s/he no longer wishes to participate in the study at any given time, s/he may withdraw without penalty from the study and that person's data will not be used.

To what degree, if any, the project will interrupt or displace the regular instructional program: This study is designed to provide minimal disruption and displacement to regular instructional programs. Students in selected English classes will be asked to participate. Of those students who consent, they will complete a survey in a campus computer lab on SurveyMonkey during their English class. The survey will be designed to be completed in no longer than 15 minutes. Teachers will be asked to complete a survey via SurveyMonkey that can be completed during



non-instructional time. Parents who consent will be taken into a computer lab during a Parent-Counselor night to complete a survey via SurveyMonkey. During the interview and focus group stages, students will be asked to participate after school hours on campus. Interviews with parents can take place at a time that is convenient for parents. Teacher interviews can take place during non-instructional time (before or after school or during a free period). Counselors will not be part of the interviews or focus groups, but instead complete their pre/post-testing during scheduled counselor professional development sessions designed by the researcher who is the Supervisor of School Counseling.

Projection of the number of pupils involved in the research project: Approximately 300 students will be randomly selected to participate in the survey portion of this project from selected English classes. English classes were chosen as each student in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12 must take English to satisfy graduation requirements. From the approximately 300 students who complete the survey via SurveyMonkey, 5-10% will be asked to participate in interviews. Of the students who participate in the interviews, 5-10% of this group of students will be invited to participate in the focus group.

List staff members who will be involved: All High School Teachers will be invited to participate in the SurveyMonkey portion of this project. Of those who choose to participate, approximately 5-10% of those teachers will be invited to participate in interviews. Of those who complete the interview portion of this study, 5-10% will be asked to participate in the focus group. All 6 of the High School Counselors in the district will be asked to participate in the pre-/post-test done before and after the professional development training done by the researcher.

List the period of time will be devoted to the research project: Upon the School Board's approval and the College of Saint Elizabeth's IRB approval, the researcher will begin to collect data which would need to be done within a 12 month period. However, the researcher estimates that the study will take approximately 6 months to complete surveys, interviews, and focus groups. The researcher will then have to analyze and code the data before writing up that chapter. Once the researcher's advisor has completed reviewing the data analysis, the researcher will design a professional development program and provide school counselors with the pre-test prior to the training and then ask school counselors to repeat the pre-test in a post-test after completing the training to see what was learned during the training.

List the project costs and the source of funding for this research project: There is no cost for teachers, students, parents, and school counselors to participate in this study. This study is the dissertation for the researcher's Ed.D. degree and any costs will be absorbed by the researcher.

Provide any background information necessary to an understanding of the project: There is a perceived cloud of mystery surrounding the role of secondary school counselors. Most teachers, students, and parents will agree that the school counselor's role is vital, however, when these stakeholders discuss their experiences with secondary school counselors and the school- counseling department there is not a universal experience. This lack of a universal



experience may be somewhat related to the reality that teachers, students, and parents may not be familiar

with the programs and services that are offered by a secondary school counseling office. More so, some teachers, students, and parents may not know exactly what the school counselor's role is in the school setting. Information that school counselors possess that is important for teachers, students, and parents, therefore, may not be accurately communicated, which may lead to unresolved answers to questions that are germane to successful student outcomes.

Description of the means by which the research project will be evaluated: The research project will be evaluated by the researcher's doctoral committee chaired by Dr. Markowitz, his second reader Dr. Ciccone, and a third reader appointed by Dr. Markowitz. The dean of the graduate school at the College of Saint Elizabeth will need to sign off on the completion of the project.

Describe the contribution the project will make to the educational program of this district: The goal of this project is three-fold. First, the researcher aims to design professional development for school counselors aimed at familiarizing them with ASCA guidelines to assist counselors with performing their jobs more efficiently. Second, the researcher wishes to address teachers', students', and parents' conceptions and misconceptions about the district's high school counseling program and the reality of what the responsibilities are of school counselors each day. The researcher hopes that this project will build better communication between teachers, students, parents, and counselors. Finally, the researcher expects to address potential changes to the program for greater accountability and transparency while completing his Doctor of Education degree.
